**DAY FOR LIFE**

This year the Day for Life focuses on all those who are suffering or have survived domestic abuse. Pope Francis wrote after the Synod on the Family: "Unacceptable customs still need to be eliminated. I think of the shameful ill-treatment to which women are sometimes subjected, domestic violence and various forms of enslavement which, rather than a show of masculine power, are craven acts of cowardice. The verbal, physical, and sexual violence that women endure in some marriages contradicts the very nature of the conjugal union."
