The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, Sacred Meal and the Priest at the Altar.

In the Extraordinary Form, Mass is celebrated according to the Missale Romanum of 1570. While this Missal was codified at the Council of Trent, it was in use at least since the time of St. Pope Gregory the Great (540 - 604). The Extraordinary Form of the Mass is the patrimony of the Western Church. This liturgy is sometimes called the 'Tridentine' Rite, after the Council of Trent in the sixteenth century. This title is misleading, because the Council of Trent did not invent the liturgy, which was even then already ancient. It is sometimes called the 'Traditional Latin Mass' as this Mass is always celebrated in the official language of the Church (i.e. Latin). Pope Benedict gave all Catholic priests permission to celebrate Mass in this form. Every Sunday this form of the Mass is celebrated at St Joseph's in Gateshead by Fr Michael Brown, and much to the delight of Fr Brown and parishioners Bishop Robert Byrne our new bishop celebrated this form of the Mass at St Joseph's on December 8th last year. The Extraordinary Form of the Mass always involves the priest facing the Tabernacle and the Crucifix, that is facing the Lord during Mass. The Congregation of the Oratory, from which Bishop Robert came, regularly celebrates the Mass this way at the London Oratory and elsewhere. In addition to this very ancient Roman Rite in Latin, priests now have permission, and from some Cardinals and Bishops are strongly encouraged, to orient themselves to face the Lord during the Eucharistic Prayer, even when saying Mass in English, if it helps them to be more concentrated on their praying to God and to be more focussed on the Sacrifice of Calvary. This stance at the Altar also shows more clearly the priest carrying out his priestly role of interceding on behalf of the people present. I do not foresee me celebrating the Extraordinary Form of the Mass in Latin at St Augustine's or St Anne's, but from the beginning of the season of Lent, when addressing the words of the Eucharistic Prayer to God the Father and interceding on your behalf, I will be facing the Tabernacle and Crucifix, Apart from this ten minute period saying the Eucharistic Prayer and the words of Consecration, the rest of the Mass – Penitential Rite, Collect, Liturgy of the Word, Homily, Intercessions, Communion and Concluding Prayers and Blessings - will all remain the same as now. For the past four years I have been celebrating Mass in this way in the weekday chapel at St Augustine's, and I find myself personally more focussed on Almighty God, less distracted and benefitting spiritually from the experience. My hope is that we may all find something helpful in this very ancient way of offering the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass and recover our awe and amazement for the mystery of the Eucharist. It may turn out to be for us a glimpse into the future, as well as an experience of the past.
