

## RECEIVING COMMUNION SAFELY AND REVERENTLY

Please remove your face covering before receiving the Blessed Sacrament into your hand.

The sacred Host must not touch the cloth/fabric and there is a danger of profanation with the Host being dropped to the floor, if you are "fiddling" with the mask with one hand, whilst holding the Host in the other hand. Both hands should be free.

## BISHOP'S INSTRUCTIONS UPDATE

The update last week continues to require:

- (1) Hand sanitizing
- (2) Use of face coverings
- (3) Social distancing of at least 1 metre
- (4) Cleaning of the church afterwards, especially touch points
- (4) Hymn books and Mass Cards can be re-introduced.
- (5) Singing permitted in a limited manner whilst wearing of face masks.
- (6) Parish Priest can decide a more strict regime, if he thinks fit, given the local conditions of rising infection rates etc.
