Ash Wednesday comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting. The practice includes the wearing of ashes

on the head. The ashes symbolize the dust from which God

you shall return." Alternatively, the priest may speak the words,

"Repent and believe in the Gospel." Ashes also symbolize grief,
