

The Anscombe Bioethics Centre in Oxford (formerly known as the Linacre Centre for Healthcare Ethics). The Centre is the oldest bioethics institute in the United Kingdom, and has for decades advised the Catholic Bishops of England and Wales, Scotland, and Ireland, and assisted Catholic medical professionals on morally difficult medical matters so as to support them in their vocation. Our efforts in education and research for Catholics who are doctors, nurses, or others working in fields related to health and social care, have never been more important or more relevant to the Church.

The Anscombe Bioethics Centre is an organisation which does research on behalf of our Bishops and education for the Catholic community on moral matters in medicine. Second World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly 24th July 2022.

The vision of this day is to celebrate and recognise the central role that grandparents and the elderly play in our communities, offering closeness and consolation as a tangible sign of the Church's mission to the world.

Pope Francis asks us to consider:

- Mass is celebrated for grandparents and the elderly on 24th July.
- Grandparents and the elderly may obtain a plenary indulgence by attending Mass on that day.
- Communities are encouraged to make a special visit to the elderly as an act of mercy which will carry a plenary indulgence.
- Elderly people unable to attend Mass in person for health reasons may obtain the plenary indulgence by taking part via live streaming.
