

St Oswald King and Martyr c. 604-642 His Feast day on Wednesday 3rd August.

He was born the son of King Ethelfrith of Northumbria. When his father was killed in battle, he fled to Scotland and was baptised at Iona.

Returning in 633, he reclaimed his kingdom by defeating Cadwalla at Heavenfield, near Hesham. His zeal to evangelise his people led him to seek the help of the Ionian Community, who sent Bishop Aidan to him c.635. Oswald gave him the island of Lindisfarne, on which he fixed his See. The king took an active part in the work of evangelisation, often travelling with Aidan, and even translating his sermons from the Celtic tongue. Oswald also helped to establish a monastery at Melrose, where St Cuthbert was to embrace the monastic life. In 642, Oswald was killed in battle against the pagan force of Penda, king of Mercia. Venerated as a martyr, he quickly became one of the most revered saints of northern England and indeed across Europe too. St Oswald pray for us.
