COVID CLARIFICATION

Cardinal Nichols was invited to a reception for Christian Church Leaders at Buckingham Palace at which the King gave an address where he said **"the Sovereign has an additional duty less formally recognised but to be no less diligently discharged. It is the duty to protect the diversity of our country, including by protecting a space for faith itself and its practice. This diversity is not just enjoined by the laws of our country it is enjoined by my own faith"**. In a personal conversation with Cardinal Nichols, the King expressed his gratitude for the prayers of the Catholics of England and Wales for his late mother.
