SECOND READING 2 Thessalonians 3: 7 - 12

Areading from the 2nd letter of St. Paul to the Thessalonians. You know how you are supposed to imitate us: now we were not idle when we were with you, nor did we ever have our meals at anyone's table without paying for them; no, we worked night and day, slaving and straining, so as not to be a burden on any of you. This was not because we had no right to be, but in order to make ourselves an example for you to follow.

We gave you a rule when we were with you: not to let anyone have any food if he refused to do any work. Now we hear that there are some of you who are living in idleness, doing no work themselves but interfering with everyone else's. In the Lord Jesus Christ, we order and call on people of this kind to go on quietly working and earning the food that they eat.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke. And they put to him this question: 'Master,' they said, 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?'

'Take care not to be deceived,' he said, 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he" and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not so soon.'Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven.

'But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name - and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defence, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair of your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.'

you come again.


PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

World Day of the Poor

The Mass today reminds us that in all despair and evils of life, the resurrection of Christ is a saving promise.

Nothing can shake the certainty that Jesus has been raised





Jesus, "though he was rich, yet for [our] sakes became poor, so that by his poverty [we] might become rich (2 Cor 8:9). These are the words Pope Francis asks us to reflect on for this sixth World Day of

the Poor. In this year when the economic shocks of pandemics, lockdowns and now the Russian invasion of Ukraine have forced more people into poverty the Pope reminds us, in solidarity with Christ, to "make charity, faith and hope the basis of our lives and our actions" (Message for the sixth World Day of the Poor pub. 13th June 2022)

Why should we open our hearts to the poor? Why not just get on with our lives, look after ourselves famously just ignore the others? It's what we do in many ways. The Pope highlights the cry of the poor each year on this Sunday. It is because of our family bond with God that we care "for those who are least, those whom society discards" (Evangelii Gaudium, 195). We care because the principal care of Jesus was for the poor. In Jesus God suffers with and for the poor, and through us all, wants to better their lot.

'Scripture constantly speaks of God acting on behalf of the poor. He is the one who "hears" their "cry" and "comes to their aid"; he "protects" and "defends" them; he "rescues" and "saves" them... Indeed, the poor will never find God indifferent or silent in the face of their plea. God is the one who renders justice and does not forget (cf. Ps 40:18; 70:6); he is their refuge, and he never fails to come to their assistance (cf. Ps 10:14).' Letter of Pope Francis for this day in 2019.

God acts today through his people. He wants equality of opportunity and of the plenty of the world for all. Again the Pope's letter for 2019: 'The God that Jesus came to reveal is a Father who is generous, merciful, unfailing in his goodness and grace. He gives hope especially to those who are disillusioned and lacking in hope for the future.' Only in the efforts in love of all of us, church and state can this become reality. "It is not talk that matters; what matters is rolling up our sleeves and putting our faith into practice through a direct involvement" (Letter for today, 2022)

Lord, as you hear the cry of poor, may we also hear this cry and respond. May your will be done.
