#### PROCESS OF COMING INTO THE CHURCH

In preparation for Baptism, those adults who are catechumens (not yet baptised) will be prayed over on three Sundays in Lent (12<sup>th</sup> 19<sup>th</sup> & 26<sup>th</sup> March) during the 9.15 am Mass. These special prayers for our catechumens include a prayer of exorcism. On Sunday 5th March they all attend a Rite of Election at the Cathedral with all other candidates for adult Baptism or Reception from across all the parishes in the diocese.

Confessions 30 minutes before Mass starts or by appointment.

### COMMUNION UNDER BOTH SPECIES

The Bishops' Conference has decided that, given the current situation regarding the spread of Covid and the fact that most people have had three or four vaccinations, a suitable time for permission to be granted for the resumption of Holy Communion under both species would be at the Mass of the Lord's Supper in Holy Week 2023. The Bishops have said that the time between now and then should be used for appropriate catechesis of the faithful regarding the significance of the reception of Holy Communion under either or both species. Important teaching, such as the totality of the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of the Lord is received in either or both species, the personal disposition of those receiving Holy Communion, and the reverence offered to the Blessed Sacrament should be included. At large concelebrations of priests, Communion under both kinds by intinction is still recommended.

Please note that this is a permission, not a requirement. The decision as to the reintroduction of Holy Communion under both species, or the timing of its reintroduction, rests with each parish priest. Note from Father Paul: "I do not intend to resume the distribution of holy Communion under both species."

#### Requirements

A Sponsor must be a **baptised** and **confirmed** Catholic, who is also in good standing with the Church.

At their Plenary meeting, the Bishops gave their final approval to the new Lectionary which will now be sent to Rome for its definitive approval. The Lectionary will use the English Standard Version – Catholic Edition with the Abbey Psalms and canticles. It is hoped that following the confirmatio from the Holy See, the Lectionary may be published and ready for use in our parishes for the beginning of Advent 2023.
