MISSION APPEAL WEEKEND 25th/26th August.

The Society was established in March 1932 by Father Patrick Whitney to support the missionary work of proclaiming the Good News in Nigeria where the people responded with unimaginable enthusiasm, Lay and religious partners made medicine and education an integral part of their mission approach to the local church. By the 1950's Nigeria was producing its own professionals in every field. Later on, Rome asked St Patrick's Society to take up missions in Kenva and later in Brazil. This has grown to include missions in Malawi, Zambia, South Sudan, South Africa, Zimbabwe, and Grenada. In 1997 students from areas where we worked began to join St Patrick's Missionary Society, and now we have many students for the priesthood from around the Continent of Africa, changing it from a largely Irish organisation to a truly International Society. The harvest is still great, and labourers are still coming.
