St Teresa Benedicta. Religious. 1891 - 1942

Wednesday we remember and celebrate at Mass St Teresa Benedicta of the Cross, who is Patron of Europe. She was born Edith Stein in Breslau, the eleventh child and youngest daughter of Jewish parents. Her university education was interrupted by the outbreak of the First World War, and she served as a nurse with the Red Cross. For a number of years, she had doubted the existence of God, but was led back to a firm faith largely through the influence of St Teresa of Avila, whose writings she devoured. Baptised in 1922, she expressed the desire to enter the Carmelites, but was dissuaded by her Spiritual directors. She embarked on a teaching career, which lasted some twelve years, until 1933, when she lost her job because of measures being taken against the Jewish population. However, Edith was now able to enter the Carmelite Monastery of Cologne, taking the name of Teresa Benedicta of the Cross. Because her presence threatened the safety of the Community, she was transferred to the Netherlands. In 1942 the Dutch bishops issued a pastoral letter condemning the persecution of the Jews, and Edith was amongst a number of Jews, who were seized in a Nazi reprisal. She was a tremendous support to her fellow prisoners on the long journey to Auschwitz, where she was immediately executed In the gas chambers. She was canonized in October 1998, and named as one of the patron saints of Europe.
